TEXAS MEDICAL RADIOLOGIC TECHNOLOGY BOARD LICENSURE COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES June 29, 2018

The meeting was called to order at 9:21 a.m. by Interim Committee Chair Nicholas M Beckmann, M.D. Committee members present were Nicholas M. Beckmann, M.D., Anthony "Tony" Jaso, and Carol Waddell, MRT.

Agenda Item 2 - Applicants appearing concerning eligibility.

Applicant #2187 failed to appear before the Committee. Ms. Waddell moved that the applicant be determined ineligible for registration as a non-certified technician (NCT) due to the applicant's criminal history, unprofessional conduct, receiving deferred adjudication/deferred disposition for a felony of moral turpitude and for submitting a false statement to the Board. Mr. Jaso seconded the motion. All voted in favor and the motion passed.

Applicant #2198 appeared before the Committee on referral by the Executive Director. The applicant presented a brief summary and the Committee members asked questions. Following discussion, **Mr. Jaso moved that be placed on the Non-Certified Radiologic Technician Registry under a public Remedial Plan subject to the following terms and conditions:**

- 1 year to complete 4 hours of continuing medical education in Ethics
- 120 days to pay the \$500 administrative fee

This recommendation is due to the applicant's criminal history. Ms. Waddell seconded the motion. All voted in favor. The motion passed.

Applicant #2203 appeared before the Committee on referral by the Executive Director. The applicant presented a brief summary and the Committee members asked questions. Following

discussion, Dr. Beckmann moved that the applicant be granted a Texas Medical Radiologic Technologist certificate under a non-disciplinary Remedial Plan with the following conditions:

- 1 year to complete 2 hours of continuing medical education in Ethics
- 120 days to pay the \$500 administrative fee

This recommendation is based on the applicant's providing a false statement regarding criminal history on their application to the Board. **Ms. Waddell seconded the motion. All voted in favor. The motion passed.**

Applicant #2164 appeared before the Committee on referral by the Executive Director. The applicant presented a brief summary and the Committee members asked questions. Following discussion, Dr Beckmann moved that the applicant be granted a Texas Medical Radiologic Technologist certificate under a public Agreed Order subject to the following terms and conditions:

- The applicant shall comply with all requirements of their probationary program with Tarrant County, Texas.
- The order shall auto terminate.

This recommendation is due to the applicant's criminal history and impairment history. **Mr. Jaso** seconded the motion. All voted in favor. The motion passed.

Applicant #2163 did not appear before the Committee. Following discussion, **Ms. Waddell moved that the applicant be placed on the Non-Certified Radiologic Technician Registry under a public Agreed Order subject to the following terms and conditions for a period of 5 years:**

• Participate in the Board's drug testing program and comply with all recommendations and requirements of the program.

- Attend AA three times a week keeping a log of all meetings attended.
- 1 year to complete 3 hours of continuing education in Ethics
- Petition for modification/termination allowed after the passage of one year, subject to complying with all terms of the order.

This recommendation is due to the applicant's criminal history, impairment and submitting a false statement to the Board. Mr. Jaso seconded the motion. All voted in favor. The motion passed.

Applicant #2197 appeared before the Committee to appeal the Executive Director's determination of a Remedial Plan due to the applicant's history and submittal of a false statement to the Board. The applicant presented a brief summary and the Committee members asked questions. Following discussion, **Dr. Beckmann moved that the committee recommend to the full Board that the applicant's appeal be granted and that the applicant be allowed to withdraw their current application and reapply providing accurate and correct responses to the questions. Upon submission of documentation confirming successful completion of the requirements the applicant be placed on the Non-Certified Radiologic Technician Registry upon approval by the Executive Director. This recommendation is due to the applicant's criminal history and submittal of a false statement on their application to the Board. Ms. Waddell seconded the motion. All voted in favor. The motion passed.**

Applicant #2199 appeared before the Committee on referral by the Executive Director. The applicant presented a brief summary and the Committee members asked questions. Following discussion, **Dr Beckmann moved that the applicant be placed on the Non-Certified Radiologic Technician Registry. Ms. Waddell seconded the motion.**

Dr. Beckmann moved to reconsider previous vote. Jr. Jaso seconded the motion. All voted in favor and the motion passed.

Dr Beckmann then moved that a determination be deferred subject to the following terms and conditions being met within a 12-month period:

- Shadow medical radiologic technologist holding at least a general certificate (MRT) ora licensed practitioner, as defined under Chapter 604 of the Texas Occupations Code, for 20 hours a week for 3 months. The supervising MRT or practitioner shall submit a work log showing time worked at the conclusion of the shadowing period.
- Complete at least 4 hours of continuing education in Ethics.

Upon submission of documentation confirming successful completion of all requirements the applicant can be placed on the Non-Certified Radiologic Technician Registry upon approval by the Executive Director. This recommendation is due to the applicant's time out of active practice prior to application. Ms. Waddell seconded the motion. All voted in favor and the motion passed.

Applicant #2200 appeared before the Committee on referral by the Executive Director. The applicant presented a brief summary and the Committee members asked questions. Following discussion, **Ms. Waddell moved that the applicant be placed on the Non-Certified Radiologic Technician Registry under a public Agreed Order subject to the following terms and conditions:**

- Applicant shall comply with all requirements of their probationary program with Tarrant County, Texas.
- 1 year to complete 4 hours of continuing medical education in Ethics.
- The order shall auto terminate upon demonstration of successful completion of all the terms of the order.

This recommendation is due to the applicant's criminal history and impairment history. **Mr. Jaso** seconded the motion. All voted in favor. The motion passed.

Applicant #2161 appeared before the Committee on referral by the Executive Director. The applicant presented a brief summary and the Committee members asked questions. Following

discussion, Ms. Waddell moved that the committee recommend to the full Board that the applicant be granted a Medical Radiologic Technologist certificate contingent upon the following conditions being met within a 12-month period:

Following discussion, **Mr. Jaso moved that the committee recommend to the full Board that the applicant be granted a Medical Radiologic Technologist certificate contingent upon the following conditions within a 6-month period:**

The applicant be issued a three month Medical Radiologic Technologist supervised temporary certificate with the following conditions: The supervised temporary certificate will have an expiration date that will allow the applicant to obtain at least 20 hours a week supervised practice for at least 20 weeks in a 3-month period subject to the following restrictions: that the applicant work full time, only in setting that provides continuous full-time, on-site supervision by a certified Medical Radiologic Technologist or licensed practitioner, as defined under Chapter 601 Texas Occupations Code; the supervising Medical Radiologic Technologist or practitioner shall submit quarterly

reports regarding the applicant's work performance; the supervising Medical Radiologic Technologist or practitioner shall submit, two weeks prior to the temporary certificate expiring, a log showing time worked and an evaluation regarding the applicant's work performance.

Upon submission of documentation confirming successful completion of all requirements the applicant can be Medical Radiologic Technologist certificate upon approval by the Executive Director. This recommendation is due to the applicant's time out of active practice prior to application. Ms. Waddell seconded the motion.

Applicant #2196 did not appear before the Committee. Following discussion, **Dr. Beckmann moved that the applicant be placed on the Non-Certified Radiologic Technician Registry contingent upon the following conditions within a 12-month period:**

• Successfully complete an approved Non-Certified Radiologic Technician Program.

This recommendation is due to the applicant's time out of active practice prior to application. Mr. Jaso seconded the motion. All voted in favor. The motion passed.

Applicant #2189 appeared before the Committee, with counsel James Hicks, on referral by the Executive Director. The applicant and counsel presented a brief summary and the Committee members asked questions. Following discussion, **Dr. Beckmann moved that the committee recommend to the full Board that the applicant be granted a Medical Radiologic Technologist certificate under a public Remedial Plan subject to the following terms and conditions:**

- 1 year to complete 8 hours of continuing medical education in Ethics
- 120 days to pay the \$500 administrative fee

This recommendation is due to the applicant's time out of active practice and unlicensed practice prior to application. Mr. Jaso seconded the motion. All voted in favor. The motion passed.

Applicant #1967 appeared before the Committee on referral by the Executive Director. The applicant presented a brief summary and the Committee members asked questions. Following discussion, **Dr. Beckmann moved that the committee recommend to the full Board Dr Beckmann moved that the applicant be granted a Limited Medical Radiologic Technologist certificate under a public Agreed Order subject to the following terms and conditions:**

- The Applicant shall comply with all requirements of their probationary program with Harris County, Texas.
- The order shall auto terminate upon demonstration of successful completion of all the terms of the order.

This recommendation is due to the applicant's criminal history and impairment history. **Mr. Jaso** seconded the motion. All voted in favor. The motion passed.

Agenda Item 3 - Proposed licensure agreed orders or remedial plans offered by the Executive Director. Ms. Johnston reported on 10 Remedial Plans offered by the Executive Director and accepted by applicants. Mr. Jaso moved that the 10 Remedial Plans be approved. Ms. Waddell seconded. All voted in favor. The motion passed.

Agenda Item 4 - There being no further business, Ms. Waddell moved that the meeting be adjourned. Mr. Jaso seconded. All voted in favor. The meeting was adjourned at 12:14 p.m.
