Licensure Committee Proposed Non-public Non-Disciplinary Rehabilitation Order Upon
Applicants Submission of a Physician in Training Permit Application
April 10, 2008

Applicant #646s application was reviewed due to mental impairment, action by a training program, malpractice, and time out of medicine.

Ms. Attebury moved to recommend to the full Board that the applicant be determined ineligible for licensure due to failure to practice medicine with reasonable skill and safety to patients because of a mental or physical condition; disciplinary action by peers; and behaving in a disruptive manner toward other hospital personnel that could reasonably be expected to adversely affect patient care. In addition, the applicant has not actively practiced medicine since 2004. Factors contributing to this recommendation include disciplinary action, including placement on probation, and acceptance of resignation in lieu of further action by the applicants residency program, due to issues regarding academic performance; poor interpersonal and communication skills; lack of respect for authority; and treatment for depression and anxiety.

Further, Ms Attebury recommended to the full Board that upon receipt, within one calendar year, of a request for a physician-in-training permit of no less than one year, the physician-in-training permit may be granted by the Executive Director under a non-public, non-disciplinary rehabilitation order that includes the following requirements:

- Submit to IPE by psychiatrist appointed by the ED and follow recommendations. If continued care recommended, Respondent submit up to 3 names as treating psychiatrist for approval of ED. Treating psychiatrist to report to Board or monitoring psychiatrist 4 times each year.
- Treating psychiatrist may agree to be monitoring psychiatrist or ED appoints a monitoring psychiatrist; monitoring psychiatrist to report to Board 2 times a year.
- Reports by Applicant/Respondent regarding physical or mental condition on request.
- Shall not withdraw from care, or treatment.
- Notify Compliance upon discontinuation of care/treatment.

- Respondent must give copy of Order to Program Director and request quarterly reports.
- May not supervise PAs and APNs.
- Probation appearance at least once 1st six months and then on request.
- Respondent must appear before the Licensure Committee before full license may be granted.
