DISCIPLINARY AND ETHICS COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES

June 6, 2008

Chair Raymond J. Graham, called the meeting to order at 11:32 a.m. Other committee members present were Chung-Hwei Chernly, L.Ac., Pedro (Pete) V. Garcia, Jr., Terry Glenn Rascoe, M.D., and Karen Siegel, L.Ac. Also present was Mari Robinson, Director of Enforcement, and various other staff.

Agenda Item #3. Reports and discussion regarding the Investigation, Litigation and Compliance Departments. Ms. Robinson presented the Enforcement Report for March 2008, a copy of which is attached. This was an informational item only and no vote was necessary.
