Licensure Committee Proposed Non-Public Non-Disciplinary Rehabilitation Order Upon
Applicants Submission of a Physician in Training Permit Application
November 29, 2007

Applicant #594s application was reviewed due to inability to practice medicine with reasonable skill and safety because of substance abuse; and not having actively practiced medicine full-time for one of the two years preceding the date of application..

Mr. Webb moved to recommend to the full Board that the applicant be determined ineligible for licensure due to the applicants inability to practice medicine with reasonable skill and safety because of substance abuse, and not having actively practiced medicine full-time for one of the two years preceding the date of application. Factors contributing to this recommendation include: a long history of substance abuse, including inpatient treatments in 1990, 1996 and 2004; not actively practicing medicine since 1997; following multiple participations in the Oregon Health Professional Program, Oregon medical license inactivated by request and in lieu of possible action on 12/2/98. Further, Mr. Webb moved to recommend to the full Board that upon receipt of a request for a physician-in-training permit for no less than one year, the physician-in-training permit may be granted by the Executive Director under a non-public, non-disciplinary rehabilitation order for the duration of the PIT that includes the following requirements:

- Abstain from alcohol and drugs, except as prescribed; comply with TMB screening program; automatic suspension of license for positive test.
- Attend AA or NA meetings at least three times each week.
- Participate in medical society health and rehabilitation
- Submit up to three names for treating psychiatrist for approval by Executive Director; see at least once every month. Treating psychiatrist to report to Board or monitoring psychiatrist four times each year.
- Treating psychiatrist may agree to be monitoring psychiatrist or the Executive Director will appoint a monitoring psychiatrist; monitoring psychiatrist to report to the Board two times each year.
- Reports by Applicant/Respondent regarding physical or mental condition on request.

- Shall not withdraw from care, or treatment.
- Notify Compliance upon discontinuation of care/treatment.
- Respondent must give copy of Order to Program Director and request quarterly reports
- Probation appearance at least once the first year and then on request.
- Respondent must appear before the Licensure Committee before full license may be granted.

NOTE FOR BOB the panel chose not to state that the applicant would not be able to supervise PAs, but it was Dr. Prices contention that PIT holders cannot supervise PAs.
