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## Board suspends San Antonio dermatologist Calvin Lee Day Jr., M.D.

On Tuesday, June 14, 2011, a disciplinary panel of the Texas Medical Board held a Temporary Suspension Hearing Without Notice and suspended the license of Calvin Lee Day Jr., M.D., Lic. No. G1883, after determining that Dr. Day's continued practice of medicine constitutes a continuing threat and real danger to his patients and to the public.

The suspension went into effect immediately.

The panel found that Dr. Day's actions and pattern of criminal conduct demonstrate that he has impaired judgment and lacks control over his behavior, rendering him unable to safely practice medicine.

On January 27, 2011, Dr. Day, a 59-year-old dermatologist in San Antonio, was arrested by the San Antonio police for sexually assaulting a patient after luring her to a locked back room at his office.

Following news coverage of that arrest, four more patients came forward with allegations that Dr. Day had sexually assaulted them as well. In addition, a former employee gave a statement to San Antonio police about a bizarre incident involving a laser hair removal machine.

On May 11, 2011, Dr. Day was indicted in Bexar County on two counts of sexual assault.

The suspension remains in effect until further action by the Board. A Temporary Suspension Hearing With Notice will be scheduled as soon as possible, unless the hearing is specifically waived by Dr. Day.
