MINUTES OF THE
DISCIPLINARY PROCESS REVIEW COMMITTEE
August 25, 2016

Chair Margaret C. McNeese, M.D., called the meeting to order at 9:44 a.m. Other members present were Julie K. Attebury, Karl W. Swann, M.D., Surendra K. Varma, M.D., Stanley Wang, M.D., and George Willeford III, M.D. Committee Members David Baucom, James “Scott” Holliday, D.O., and Manuel Guajardo, M.D. were not present. Allan Shulkin, M.D, who was not present at roll call, arrived at 10:16 a.m.

Staff members present were Mari Robinson, Executive Director, Robert Bredt, M.D., Medical Director, and various other staff.

Agenda Item #2. Discussion, recommendation, and possible action regarding referrals from the Texas Physician Health Program (PHP).

Dr. Willeford moved, and Dr. Varma seconded that PHP Case #1 be returned to the jurisdiction of the Texas Medical Board. Motion carried.

Dr. Willeford moved, and Dr. Wang seconded that PHP Case #2 be returned to the jurisdiction of the Texas Medical Board. Motion carried.

Dr. Varma moved, and Ms. Attebury seconded that PHP Case #3 remain under the management of PHP. Motion carried.

Dr. Varma moved, and Ms. Attebury seconded that PHP Case #4 be returned to the jurisdiction of the Texas Medical Board. Motion carried.

Dr. Willeford moved, and Dr. Wang seconded that PHP Case #5 remain under the management of PHP. Motion carried.

It was announced by Dr. Fitzwater that PHP Case #6 be withdrawn from the agenda.

Dr. Willeford moved, and Ms. Attebury seconded that PHP Case #7 be returned to the jurisdiction of the Texas Medical Board. Motion carried.

Agenda Item #3. Reports and discussion regarding Texas Physician Health Program. (Dr. Fitzwater)

This was an informational item only and no vote was necessary.

Agenda Item #7. Review, discussion, and possible action regarding clarification of the meaning of zero tolerance referrals from TXPHP.

Direction was given to staff that the definition of zero tolerance be based on substantive non-compliance, as defined in the policy and procedures for TXPHP, and that the terms “substantive non-compliance” and “zero tolerance” be used interchangeably.

Agenda Item #4. Discussion, recommendation, and possible action regarding renewals involving impaired licensees. (Ms. Robinson)

Dr. Varma moved, and Dr. Willeford seconded that Licensee #1 send letter outlining all options available but re-urging potential retirement. Motion carried.

Dr. Willeford moved, and Dr. Varma seconded that Licensee #2 send letter outlining all options available. Motion carried.

Dr. Varma moved, and Dr. Willeford seconded that Licensee #3 ask for a letter from treating physician and send letter outlining all options available. Motion carried.

Agenda Item #5. Reports and discussion regarding the Investigation, Litigation, and Compliance Departments.

Ms. Robinson presented the Enforcement Report for July 2016, a copy of which is attached. This was an informational item only and no vote was necessary.

Agenda Item #6. Review, discussion, and possible action regarding the possibility of an administrative FO-4 Waiver for the Compliance department.

Direction was given to staff to try waivers out for 6 weeks, one-time usage only, and bring information back before the committee in October.

Agenda Item #8. Review, discussion, and possible action regarding review of probationer’s appearances.

Dr. Willeford moved, and Ms. Attebury seconded that the waiver list on Agenda Item #08 be approved. Motion carried.

Agenda Item #9. Consideration and approval of membership of the Expert Physician Panel.

Dr. Varma moved, and Dr. Wang seconded that the appointments of members to the Expert Panel be accepted as noted in the attachment. Motion carried.

Agenda Item #10. Reports and discussion regarding cases over one year old.

Ms. Robinson presented to the DPRC the current status of cases that are over one year old. To date, all investigations over one year are in criminal courts for a resolution and the majority of the litigation cases are at SOAH. This was an informational item only and no vote was necessary.

Agenda Item #12. Discussion, recommendation, and possible action regarding routine follow-up on investigative files previously referred from the DPRC for follow-up action, specifically including:

It was announced by Ms. Robinson that there were not any follow-up files to be presented to the DPRC for consideration under Agenda Item 12.

Dr. McNeese moved, and Ms. Attebury seconded; the motion passed at 10:49 pm. to go into Executive Session for deliberations concerning disciplinary action, investigative information, peer review information, and rehabilitation orders under the authority of The Medical Practice Act Sections 152.009, 160.006 through .008, 164.007(c), Texas Occupations Code. Open session resumed at 2:20 p.m., and it was announced that no action was taken during executive session. A certified agenda of the executive session was made.

Ms. Attebury moved, and Dr. Wang seconded that the investigations and cases reviewed by the committee be resolved as noted and that they be listed along with each resolution as part of the minutes of this Committee. Motion carried.

Dr. Wang moved, and Dr. Swann seconded that the appeal of Item 11.B, Log #16-4468 be granted and the investigation continued to get experts. Motion carried.

Ms. Attebury moved, and Dr. Varma seconded that all other appeals under Agenda Item 11.B not specifically granted above be denied. Motion carried.

- Impairment(s) Reported: Diagnosed with Lumbar Spinal stenosis with back and left leg sciatica and right leg radiculitis.

Issue(s):

02/04/2016: Licensee reported impairment on registration renewal application.

02/13/2016: TMB mailed an impairment packet.

03/21/2016: TMB received a response to the Registration Mental and Physical Health form. Licensee reported having lumbar spinal stenosis with back and left leg sciatica and right leg radiculitis. The prognosis is unclear and at this point is not practicing. Licensee reported currently seeking herbal treatment in India.

05/05/2016: TMB sent follow-up letter requesting a letter from the Licensee's treating physician

05/19/2016: TMB received a letter from the treating physician who stated that the licensee has severe pain that is suggestive of a chronic nerve root issue. A lumbar fusion was performed but the licensee is still reporting a significant amount of disabling pain, particularly with activity. The physician states that the functional capacity as a physician is significantly impaired and supports the licensee's request for indefinite medical leave.

04/05/2016: TMB mailed the Registration Mental and Physical Health form.

06/13/2016: TMB received a response to the Registration Mental and Physical Health form. Licensee reported being diagnosed with chronic cervicalgia resulting from a fractured pelvis and herniating a disc, causing increased migraine headaches, chronic sacral pain, and fecal incontinence. Licensee retired and closed their medical practice but hopes to return to practice.

06/13/2016: TMB received a letter from licensee's treating physician, who reported that the licensee was injured from a fall on 8/31/2011 and had a discectomy and fusion at C5 which resolved the radicular pain and right hand weakness. The licensee has since developed chronic cervicalgia and a significant increase in migraine headaches. The prognosis is poor and the treating physician states that the licensee knows full time practice is not sustainable and has already limited physical demands.

03/09/2016: TMB mailed the Registration Mental and Physical Health form.

04/25/2016: TMB received a response to the Registration Mental and Physical Health form. Licensee reported being diagnosed with Osteoarthritis of the finger, knees, and spine with a slowly deteriorating prognosis. Some range of motion has been lost in the fingers, knees, and c-spine and the hands have a loss of sensation and fine manipulative ability. Anti-inflammatory medication, pain medication, and joint replacement as needed are the current treatments used, including Naproxen, Tylenol, and Aleve. The licensee no longer practices Emergency Medicine and in fact is not practicing currently but would carefully consider an interesting practice opportunity if it came up.

07/05/2016: TMB received a letter from Licensee stating that the licensee is not receiving treatment for the diagnosis so there is no treating physician. Licensee states that a total knee replacement was done two years ago and the other knee will likely be replaced in two to five years. Cervical spine surgery was done seven years ago to correct numbness and weakness in the hands, which improved after surgery but never completely resolved.
