Licensure Committee Proposed Non-Public Non-Disciplinary Rehabilitation Order  
May 18, 2007

Applicant #548s application was reviewed due to the applicants history of mental impairment due to Major Depressive Disorder; action taken by a health care entity, and being out of practice since December 2004..

Dr. Mitchell moved to recommend to the full board that the applicant be issued a temporary license with an expiration date that will allow the applicant to obtain at least 12 months of supervised practice on the condition that the applicant only work in a setting that provides continuous full-time, on-site physician supervision. The 12 month temporary license will be granted under a non-public, non-disciplinary rehabilitation order that includes the requirements listed below. Two weeks prior to the temporary license expiring, the supervising physician will submit to this office a log showing time worked and an evaluation to board staff regarding the applicants work performance. If this evaluation is favorable, the applicants will be offered a non-public rehabilitation order for a period of four years, and the applicants name may be placed on a list of applicants who have met all requirements for licensure to be considered at the following board meeting. If the evaluation is unsatisfactory, the applicant will be required to appear at the following Board meeting for reconsideration of the application.

- Applicant will submit up to three names as treating psychiatrists for approval by Executive Director. Applicant will see treating psychiatrist quarterly, or as determined by treating psychiatrist.
- Submit reports regarding physical or mental condition on request.
- Shall not withdraw from care or treatment.
- Will notify Compliance Dept upon discontinuation of care or treatment.
- Probation appearance at any time on request with 10 days notice.
