Medical Board Suspends License of Peter C. Okose, M.D.

The Texas Medical Board has temporarily suspended the license of Peter C. Okose, M.D., license #J2714, of Houston, after determining that Dr. Okose's continuation in the practice of medicine presents a continuing threat to the public welfare. A temporary suspension hearing was scheduled for Thursday, July 13. However, Dr. Okose waived his right to a hearing and signed an agreed order of temporary suspension.

The action was based on the following violations of the Medical Practice Act: Dr. Okose failed to maintain adequate medical records that are complete, contemporaneous and legible for 13 patients; he failed to treat these patients according to the generally accepted standard of care; he prescribed dangerous drugs or controlled substances without first establishing a proper professional relationship with these patients; he failed to adhere to established guidelines for prescriptions of pain medications to these patients; and he prescribed these drugs nontherapeutically.

The order was signed on Tuesday, July 11, and was effective immediately. The length of a temporary suspension order is indefinite but it remains in effect until the board takes further action.
