55 Doctors Disciplined

During its December 12-13 Board meeting, the Texas State Board of Medical Examiners took disciplinary action against 55 licensed physicians, who received one or more of the following actions: 10 surrender/revocations, of which three were stayed and probated under various terms and conditions; 15 suspensions, of which nine were stayed and probated under various terms and conditions; 13 restrictions; and four public reprimands. Fifteen administrative penalties totaling \$71,000 were assessed. In addition, one temporary suspension was imposed since the October 3-4 Board meeting.

The Texas State Board of Physician Assistants took action against six physician assistants at its November 15 meeting.

New Licenses Issued

During its December 12-13 Board meeting, the Board approved the licensure applications of 454 physicians.

Rule Changes

The Board adopted the following proposed rule changes that were published in the Texas Register: Chapter 163, Licensure: Amendments to §§163.1 and 163.3-.5 regarding examinations accepted by the board, and general cleanup of the chapter. Chapter 171, Postgraduate Training Permits: Amendments to §171.2 regarding streamlining the process of issuing postgraduate training permits. Proposed amendment to §171.1 was withdrawn. Chapter 173, Physician Profiles: Amendments to §173.1 regarding board actions contained in the profile. Chapter 177, Certification of Non-Profit Health Organizations: Amendment to §177.16 regarding the complaint procedure notification. Chapter 183, Acupuncture: Amendment to §183.13 regarding the complaint procedure notification. Chapter 184, Surgical Assistants: Amendments to §§184.19 and 184.21 regarding the complaint procedure notification and correction of the name of a surgical assistant association. Chapter 187, Procedural Rules: Amendments to §§187.16, 187.27 and 187.28 regarding informal board proceedings, State Office of Administrative Hearings

proceedings, default judgments, and discovery. Proposed amendment to \$187.18 was withdrawn.

Chapter 188, Complaint Procedure Notification: Rule review and amendment to §188.1 regarding the forms for complaint procedure notification. Chapter 197, Emergency Medical Services: Rule review and amendments to §§197.2 and 197.3 regarding definitions and responsibilities of the off-line medical director. Chapter 199, Public Information: Amendment to §199.2 regarding clarification of the deadline for members of the public to submit requests to speak to the Public Information Committee.

Proposed Rule Changes

The Board proposed the following rule changes for publication in the Texas Register and comment: Chapter 164, Physician Advertising: Rule review. Chapter 183, Acupuncture: Reorganization and general cleanup of the chapter. Chapter 184, Surgical Assistants: Proposed amendments to §§184.4, 184.6 and 184.8 regarding examinations, licensure documentation and licensure renewal. Chapter 190, Disciplinary Guidelines: Rule review. Chapter 191, District Review Committee: Proposed amendments for general cleanup and rule review. Chapter 193, Standing Delegation Orders, proposed change to §193.6(i)(2)(C) to include Physician Assistants in the language regarding supervision waiver requests.

Proposed amendments to Chapter 174, Telemedicine, were sent back to staff for changes. Proposed amendment to Chapter 175, Fees, Penalties and Applications, amendments to §§175.1 and 175.4 relating to fees and applications required for reissuance of a physician assistant license was sent back to the Texas State Board of Physician Assistant Examiners for reconsideration. Proposed amendment to §183.20 referring to continuing acupuncture education was sent back to the Texas State Board of Acupuncture Examiners with suggested amendments regarding continuing acupuncture education hours. Proposed rule change to Chapter 193, Standing Delegation Orders, new §§193.11 and 193.12 relating to the use of lasers, was deferred until the next board meeting and all interested parties meet to discuss and resolve the issues of site supervision and having the initial visit of the patient be done by a physician.

If a Motion for Rehearing is filed and the Board grants the motion, the Order is not final and a hearing will be scheduled.

Action due to unprofessional or dishonorable conduct that is likely to deceive or defraud the public or injure the public; inability to practice medicine with reasonable skill and safety to patients because of illness, drunkenness, excessive use of drugs, narcotics, chemicals, or another substance, or as a result of any mental or physical condition; and failure to practice medicine in an acceptable professional manner consistent with public health and welfare.

An Agreed Order was entered on 12-13-02 assessing an administrative penalty in the amount of \$1,000. Action due to violation of Board rules.

An Agreed Order was entered on 12-13-02 restricting the physician's license. Action due to failure to practice medicine in an acceptable professional manner consistent with public health and welfare.

The agency is seeking new legislation to expand current statutory authority to better fulfill its mission to ensure only competent licensees are providing medical care.
